

Codicil

It's a straightforward process to add a gift to Restore as part of your will. If you have already made your will, this codicil form will allow you to alter it. The form will need to be signed and witnessed in the same way as when you made your will.

Once completed, the form should be stored with the original copy of your will. We strongly suggest that you check any alterations to your will with your solicitor. Thank you so much for supporting Restore in this way and being part of our vision of empowering people with mental health problems now and into the future.

If the charity to which a legacy is left in this Codicil has amalgamated with or transferred its assets to any other body or has ceased to exist at the date of my death then my Executors shall pay the legacy made by this Codicil to such registered charity or charities and if more than one in such shares as my Executors in their absolute discretion think fit **AND I EXPRESS THE WISH** but without imposing any trust or obligation that in carrying out the foregoing trust my Executors seek to benefit a charity or charities as close as possible in purpose to that intended to be benefited by my said original legacy

Instructions for signing

1. Write your full name and address at the top of page 1.
2. Confirm whether this is a First/Second/Third Codicil to your Will by deleting the options that don't apply. Write the date on which you made your Will at the top of page 1. The date can be in numbers or words, it does not matter which.
3. In clause 1, fill in the amount that you wish to leave to Restore in words.
4. Delete clause 2 if this is not your wish.
5. Sign your name on page 2 at the end of the document. You may sign as you normally sign cheques and other documents.
6. Your witnesses must sign and add their names and add their addresses and occupations. You should all three be together and see one another sign BUT the witnesses do not need to read the document.
7. Your witnesses should not be Executors of your Will. They cannot be beneficiaries of your Will (people whom you have left gifts), or be married to anyone who is a beneficiary. They should be over 18 and capable of understanding that they are witnessing your signature on a legally binding document.
8. Do not attach anything to the document. In particular do not attach paper clips or pins as this may cause problems when your Executors need to use the Will.
9. We recommend that you ask your solicitor to check that the document has been signed correctly.
